

100th Anniversary of the Cross Mountain Mine Disaster Briceville, Tennessee Friday, 9 December 2011

- 9:00 a.m. Memorial Service at Briceville Community Church/Cemetery, which was built in 1888 by Welsh coal miners and listed on the National Register of Historic Places.... After an opening prayer, the church bell will toll, names of miners will be read, songs written to honor them will be sung, and farewell messages will be recited. Then, we want to hear from descendants of the Cross Mountain miners. The names of the 84 miners who died in 1911 are listed on the attached memorial program from 1912.
- 10:30 a.m. Dedication of Cross Mountain Miners' Circle in Briceville being listed on the National Register of Historic Places, while Tony Thomas and students from Briceville Elementary School sing, "Will the Circle Be Unbroken."
- 11:15 a.m. Tour of the abandoned portal site in Slatestone Hollow. Tennessee coal miners created a living memorial to Cross Mountain miners this year by planting half a million trees on mine sites backfilled using the Forestry Reclamation Approach. Descendants can enrich that region-wide memorial by planting six American chestnut seedlings beside the old Cross Mountain Mine portal -- one for each of the five miners rescued in 1911 (Milton Henderson, William Henderson, Dore Irish, Arthur Scott, and Irving Smith), and one for mine rescue crews then and now.
